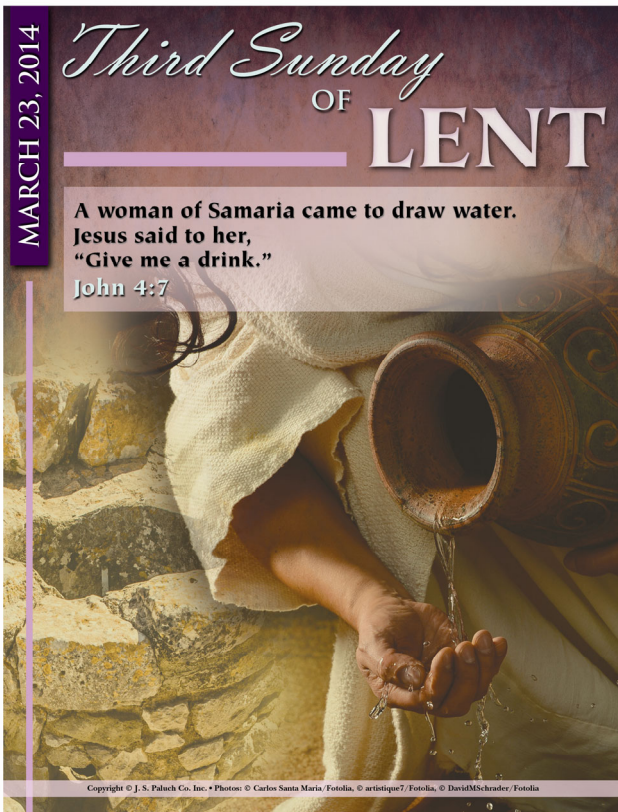

From Fr. Gary's pen...

It should come as no surprise that hearing loss is a growing problem in our society. Just look at the number of commercials on radio and TV for hearing aids. Studies show that young people in particular have suffered damage to their ears from music and electronic devices. In the adult world, politics and social media have led to talking points so extreme that they sound like foreign languages.

Lent is a time to allow the Lord to touch our ears so that they may be healed. As Jesus says to the deaf mute in Mark's gospel: "Ephphatha, that is 'be opened'!!" (Mark 7:34). During Lent we remove ourselves from the excessive noise that makes us deaf to the God whom Elijah hears, not in the earthquake, but in the "tiny whispering sound." We are very good at the prayer of speech but relative strangers to the prayer of silence. When there is extended silence at Mass, we instinctively wonder what went wrong. Perhaps we do not fear so much that God is silent, but that He has something to say to us.

We have to admit that we have slowly polluted our lives with noise. When we walk, we wear earphones. When we drive, our cars talk to us. When we eat, we hear the TV or send millions of text messages but cannot discern the signs of the times. During Lent we are invited once again to tune out the noise so we can tune in to God. Let us all fast from talking and other noisy distractions so that the silence may create a pregnant pause, a quiet space where the Word made flesh may be born again. Deo Gratias! Happy Spring!

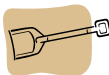
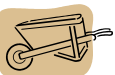
Cemetery Beautification Project April 5th @ 9:00a.m.

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Parish Council Meeting 2/25/14

Opened meeting with a prayer by Father Gary.

Donut Sunday schedule was passed out to all members. Still need a Donut Sunday Coordinator. Need to put notice in the bulletin for someone to work with current coordinator and then take over position.

Welcoming Committee stated that new families to the parish were welcomed at the January Donut Sunday.

The School Board is having a Town Hall meeting on Monday, March 10th at 6:30 pm in the Parish Center. The Self-Improvement Process (SIP) Evaluation Team is coming to St. Theodore on March 18th & 19th.

The School Board Members are making follow-up calls to families who attended our Open House and also, contacting potential families in our parish. Registration for current school families went out last week. It was discussed to have the Parish Council minutes and the School Board minutes on Fast Direct.

The Finance Committee informed that the projected budget enrollment for 2014-15 is 180 students. Therefore, the school budget will need to be cut due to enrollment down this year and the upcoming school year. Tuition rates will increase by 3%, however, surrounding parishes are also raising their tuition and other rates and fees, such as lunches, etc.. Because we are running on a deficit, we are using up our savings and it will not be there for next year. It was discussed that we need to encourage families who need help with tuition to apply to the Catholic Family Tuition Assistance Program, along with the Archdiocese Alive in Christ Program. All parishes in the Archdiocese are required to send a set percentage to fund the Alive in Christ program, so we need to utilize this source of support. This assistance would not only help the family, but also our parish.

Parish Office reported that the maintenance fund to date is at \$123,633. The Dinner Auction was a success, even though it was down a little from last year. The cafeteria is doing better than last year, however, the parish is still subsidizing about \$5800 year to date. A new parish pictorial directory has been deferred till next year. Cuneen Offertory Enhancement, a nine week program to build stewardship in parishes, was tabled.

Father passed out an information sheet on the proposed Four-Year Visionary Plan for Future Growth which will be discussed at the next meeting.

Father closed with a prayer.

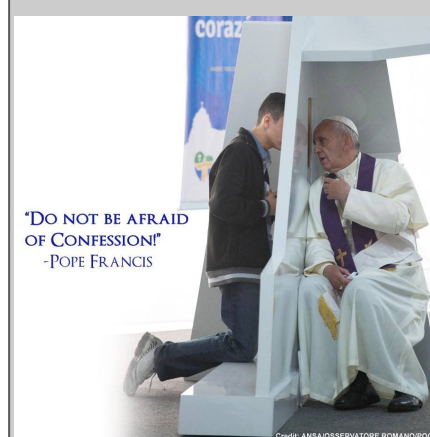

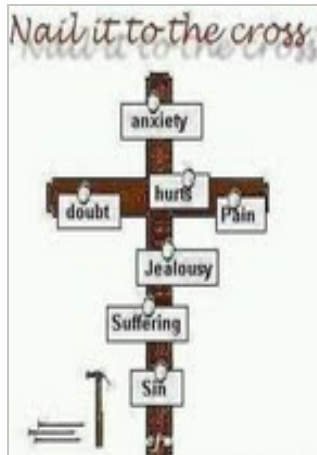
