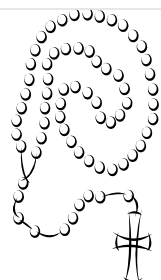

From Fr. Gary's pen...

We have begun the ordinary time of the church year until Lent starts in March. I once heard the story in which an older priest (not me) had a conversation with a younger priest (maybe me) who was going through a hard time in his priestly life. The older priest asked the younger one, "How are you doing?" The younger priest replied, "I'm doing pretty well, under the circumstances." To which the older priest replied, "What's a Christian doing under the circumstances? What do circumstances have to do with faith?" That question has stayed with me throughout my priesthood. Are people of faith called to rise above their circumstances? Is that what the Bible means by telling us "to rejoice in the Lord always?"

These ordinary and somewhat cold, dark and dreary days when we all seem to have the "blahs" and the "blues" (not the St. Louis Blues) and the flu (or a cold) can be a drag. The weather is cold and gray, the bills are piling up, the consequences of overspending and overeating loom large. Yet, the Bible tells us to rejoice always! This seems like very strange advice.

How can I rejoice today and every ordinary day of the year when our world is dealing with unemployment, ethnic violence, wars, hunger, terrorism, and the list goes on and on. What do we have to rejoice about on days like today? How can we rejoice under these circumstances? The answer comes from Jesus in the Gospels. Not once in the Gospels does Jesus promise us a happy, easy, prosperous, and abundant life to those who follow Him.

Today and every ordinary day we can rejoice, but not because everything is as it should be. We rejoice because the Kingdom of God is drawing near, very near, if we have eyes to see and ears to hear. If we allow God to overturn our expectations, He just might choose to do more through us than we have ever asked for or imagined, regardless of our "circumstances." Deo Gratius!!

Spiritual Communication

Do we give the Lord the first fruits of our time every week by attending Mass? Do we set an example for our children and grandchildren by attending Mass and joyously participating in the celebration of Mass each week? How do we know what God wants us to do unless we communicate with Him?

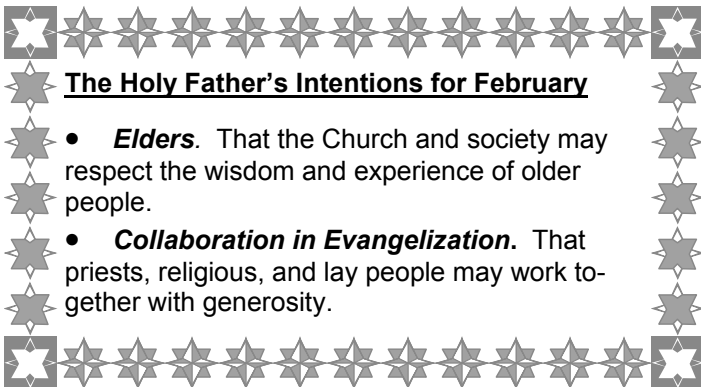
